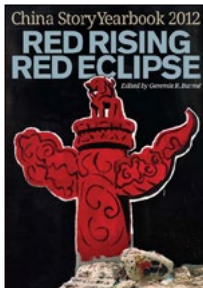
2014: *Shared Destiny*
