Resources

Printed materials are available from fivesenseseducation.com.au (search for Gamilaraay). Most resources are also available online at yuwaalaraay.com.

Dictionary: The *Gamilaraay, Yuwaalaraay & Yuwaalayaay Dictionary* (Ash, Lissarrague & Giacon, 2003) is available as a book and online.

Giacon (2017) refers to the published versions of his 2014 thesis, 'Yaluu: A recovery grammar of Yuwaalaraay and Gamilaraay based on 160 years of records'. The book is available as a free pdf download, an ebook or in printed form.

Website: At yuwaalaraay.com there is a blog, information about courses and links to many resources, including *Gayarragi*, *Winangali*, a computer program with a comprehensive dictionary, as well as sound files, many sentences, songs, games and more.

Sound files associated with *Wiidhaa* are also on yuwaalaraay.com.

Tapes: Reference is sometimes made to the Yuwaalaraay tapes of Arthur Dodd and Fred Reece, which are held at AIATSIS (Australian Institute of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Studies), Canberra. The reference has the tape number and the number of seconds into the tape. For instance, tape 3219B 544 indicates 544 seconds from the beginning of tape 3219B.

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
