

## About the Author

Marie Hansen Fels has a first class honours degree in History, including Archaeology and Anthropology, from the University of Melbourne: her thesis on the earliest Tasmanian colonial period, 1803–1811 was published by the Tasmanian Historical Research Association. Her PhD won the Harbison Higinbothom Scholarship for the best PhD submitted in the arts and social sciences for the period 1986–88, and was published by Melbourne University Press as *Good Men and True: the Aboriginal Police of the Port Phillip District 1837–1853*. She was awarded the Colonel George Johnston post doctoral scholarship to the University of Sydney in the Lenten Term 1987. In 1988 she researched the *Dandenong Police Paddocks* published in two volumes by Victoria Archaeological Survey (VAS) as *Early Use as Native Police Headquarters and Aboriginal Protectorate Station 1837–1853*, and *Land History and Use 1851–1988*. In 1989 she was employed by VAS to research *Some Aspects of the History of Coranderrk Station* published in 1998. In 1990 she researched *A History of the Ebenezer Mission*, Occasional Report No 51 published by Aboriginal Affairs Victoria. A comparison of the early contact histories of Tasmania and Victoria was published in the *Bulletin of the Centre for Tasmanian Historical Studies* in 1991–92. In 1993 she produced a report for Telecom on the Acheron-Mohican Aboriginal Reserve. She was the expert witness, History, for the Victorian and New South Wales governments in the Yorta Yorta Native Title case. She is the author of numerous reviews.
