Adrian Horridge was appointed in 1960 as Director of the Gatty Marine Laboratory, St Andrews, Scotland, while completing the two-volume work with Professor T. H. Bullock of the University of California on *The Structure and Function of the Nervous Systems of Invertebrates* (1965). At St Andrews, he started a research group that worked on the eyes of crustaceans and insects. In 1969, he brought this group with him to Australia, when he was appointed as one of four foundation professors of the Research School of Biological Sciences at The Australian National University. Since that time, he and his numerous students and postdoctoral collaborators have discovered much about the vision of insects. In 1969, Horridge was elected a Fellow of the Royal Society of London and in 1972 a Fellow of the Australian Academy of Sciences.
