<i>acolhimento</i>	welcome and reintegration ritual commonly used to reintegrate former militia members into the community
<i>adat</i>	Indonesian term for customary village law still widely used in Timor-Leste. It is for Timorese a synonym of the Tetum word for customary village justice, <i>lisan</i>
