

Addendum

The lycaenid butterfly *Candalides heathi* (Rayed Blue) was recently recorded from the study region. A male in good condition was collected from the Northern Deserts at Camfield Station at the northern edge of the Tanami Desert, NT (17°06'14.1"S, 131°31'27.9"E) by Jared Archibald on 15 September 2018. The species was previously unknown from the study region, having been recorded from arid and semi-arid areas further south and east – the nearest localities being at 270 km ENE of Alice Springs, NT and at 20 km SSW of Normanton, Qld near the Gulf of Carpentaria. This additional species brings the total list for the monsoon tropics of northern Australia to 164 species (133 butterflies and 31 diurnal moths).
